By making a bequest to the Library, you can help to ensure that Sir Redmond Barry's vision is kept alive.






Making a bequest

A bequest is a provision in your will that names the recipient or recipients of your estate. In making a bequest to the State Library of Victoria you may wish to specify an amount of money or a percentage of your estate, the remainder of your estate, a book collection or work of art, or other items such as shares or real estate.

Bequests can be general or specific. A general bequest allows the Library Board of Victoria to allocate the funds wherever the need is greatest. With a specific bequest, you select how you would like the funds to be allocated. You may wish, for example, to support a particular program or part of the Library's collection.

Redmond Barry Society membership

Membership of the Redmond Barry Society is open to anyone whose Library bequest has been confirmed. Members enjoy a stimulating program of tours, viewings and functions that reflect the work of the Library and the valuable role it plays in the Victorian community.
