Select biographical register of staff of the Melbourne Public Library/ Public Library of Victoria, c. 1856–1970

The following details of Library staff mentioned in the memoirs of E La Touche Armstrong, Leigh Scott and Colin McCallum have been compiled by Shona Dewar and John Arnold from a variety of sources including the Victorian Public Service Lists, E La Touche Armstrong, *The Book of the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria: 1856–1906*, Melbourne: The Trustees, 1906, and the *Australian Dictionary of Biography* (adb.anu.edu.au, cited here as *ADB*). Note that in some cases life dates have not been confirmed. Biographical details on many of the Trustees mentioned in these memoirs can also be found in *ADB*.

Armstrong, Edmund La Touche (1864–1946), MA, LLB; first appointed 1881; Chief Librarian, 1896–1925. Astley, Harold Selwyn (1909–2002), BA, LLB; first appointed 1926; Assistant, 1926; awarded free university place for public servants to study arts, 1932; later a solicitor. See obituary, *Herald Sun*, 12 Sep. 2002.

Battye, John Sykes (1871–1954), library Assistant, 1889–94. Later Chief Librarian at the Public Library of Western Australia. See *ADB*.

Baud, William Charles (1890–1945), BA; first appointed 1911; Assistant, 1912; Senior Assistant, 1926; Assistant Librarian, 1939; Chief Librarian, 1944–45. See appointment as Chief Librarian, *The Age*, 5 Dec. 1944, p. 2; obituary, *The Age*, 3 Oct. 1945, p. 6. **Boys, Robert Douglass** (1866–1942), BA; first appointed 1883; Senior Assistant, 1900; Assistant Librarian, 1913; Chief Librarian, 1925–31; retired 1931. Author of *First Years at Port Phillip: preceded by a summary of historical events from 1768*, Melbourne: Robertson & Mullens, 1935.

Brazier, Amos William (1862–1929), MA; first appointed 1881; Assistant, 1889; Sub-Librarian, 1900; Assistant Librarian, 1913; retired 1922. Author of Marcus Clarke: his work and genius, Melbourne: Echo, 1902; Libraries and Librarianship, Melbourne: The Author, 1912; The Terms and the Grammar of Creation: a new method, Melbourne: The Author, 1919, and other works.

Bride, Thomas Francis (1849–1927), University of Melbourne, Doctor of Laws; University Assistant Librarian 1873–81. Appointed Chief Librarian of Melbourne Public Library in 1881. Set about improving the administration of the Library and appointing a more professional staff. He retired from the Library in 1895. See ADB.



Bryant, Frederick Stephen (1864–1944), first appointed 1887; Supervisor, 1906; Heidelberg City Councillor, 1914–35. See death notice, *Argus*, 15 Dec. 1944, p. 2.

Cannam, Duncan William Inkersole

(1907–1943), first appointed 1927; Assistant, 1927; military service, 1942–43: Warrant Officer Class 2, 2/7 Independent Company, Australian Army, killed on active service in New Guinea in February 1943. See www.ww2roll.gov.au/Veteran. aspx?ServiceId=A&VeteranId=476683

Clarke, Marcus Andrew Hislop (1846–1881), Sub-Librarian, author and journalist. Crawford, William (b. 1891); first appointed 1913; Attendant, Ararat Lunatic Asylum, 1913; military service, 1914–17; Attendant, PLV, 1921; Library Attendant, 1934; Senior Library Attendant, 1940; retired 1952.

Croll, Robert Henderson (1869–1947), Library Assistant, 1886–91. Later public servant and author. See entry in *ADB*.

Dreiheller, Erica Annette Lucia (b. 1924), temporary Assistant, 1947; first appointed 1947; Assistant, 1947; left PLV before 1950. See Argus, 11 Dec. 1945, p. 2; *The Age*, 31 Aug. 1950, p. 5.

Dwyer, John Beynon (1904–1999), BA, LLB; first appointed 1925; Assistant, 1926; solicitor with Desmond Dunne, Harty & Dwyer; Mayor of Warrnambool, 1947–50; awarded OBE. Edwards, David William (b. 1863), first appointed 1888; Attendant, 1889; Library Attendant, 1900; Senior Library Attendant, 1926.

Esson, Thomas Louis Buvelot (1878–1943), Library Assistant, later a noted poet and dramatist. See entry in *ADB*.

Evans, John Albert (1887–1968), first appointed 1907; Income Tax Department, -1926; Accountant and Assistant Secretary to PLV, 1926; Secretary to Police Department, 1943. Feely, John Andrew (1902–1965), BSc; first appointed 1921; Assistant, 1927; Senior Assistant, 1939; Assistant Chief Librarian, 1950; Chief Librarian, 1960–65. Compiler of the *Argus Index: 1846–April 1859*, 5 vols (typescript, SLV with volume covering 1846–54 published by the Library Council of Victoria in 1976).

Foxcroft, Albert Broadbent (1884–1938), MA; first appointed 1902; Assistant, 1908; Senior Assistant, 1922; Assistant Librarian, 1933; died while employed at PLV. Fraser, Isabella Agnes Mary (1881–1969), BA; first appointed 1908; Assistant, 1924; retired 1946. See Minutes of the Public Library Trustees, 8 Mar. 1946, p. 521.

Frazer, Eric Lindsay (1892–1965), BA, FLAA; first appointed 1910; Junior Assistant, 1911; transferred from State Audit Office to PLV, 1913; military service, 1915–19; transferred to Victorian Parliamentary Library, 1923; Librarian, Victorian Parliamentary Library, 1926–57; retired 1957. Gagliardi, Pasquale Ferdinando (1843–1898), Doctor of Laws, University of Pisa. Emigrated to New Zealand in 1876 where his brother was living, then moved to Victoria in 1877. In 1881, began working in the Public Library part time. Appointed the first Principal Librarian 1883. He twice declined the appointment of Chief Librarian, 1895 and 1896. Ingram, Ethel Frances (b. 1899), first appointed 1926; Shorthand Writer and Typist, 1926; Senior Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), PLV, National Gallery of Victoria and Museums, 1949.

Kealy, Thomas Arthur (b. 1909), BA; first appointed 1926; Assistant, 1927; military service, 1942–45; Senior Librarian, 1950; Acting Chief Librarian, 1965–67.

Kirby, Frank Gordon (1885–1963), first appointed 1905; Assistant, 1914; teacher at Scotch College, 1920–55; author of Libraries in Secondary Schools: a report on the libraries of secondary schools in Victoria ... Melbourne: Melbourne University Press, 1945.

Lodewyckx, Karel Axel (1910–1990), BA, FLAA; first appointed 1929; Assistant, 1929; military service, World War II; Australian War Memorial, 1944–46; PLV, 1946; resigned 1948; Deputy Librarian, University of Melbourne, 1948–; Librarian, University of Melbourne, 1956–73; author of *The Funding of Wisdom: revelations of a library's quarter century*, Melbourne, Spectrum, 1982. See University of Melbourne Calendar, 1949, p. 484. **McCall, William** (b. 1910), first appointed 1926; Clerk, Public Service Board, 1949.

McCallum, Colin Alexander (1895–1981), Chief Librarian, 1945–60. See introduction to 'Looking back – the PLV 1919–1960', pp. 66–8 of this issue.

McDonald, Arthur Leopold Gladstone

(1898–1981), BA; first appointed 1924; Assistant, 1924; Deputy Librarian, University of Melbourne, 1927–48; military service, 1941–45; inaugural Librarian, Australian National University, 1948–60. 
Morphett, William Stanley (b. 1887), first appointed 1921; NGV Attendant, 1922; NGV Senior Attendant, 1938; Supervisor and Caretaker, 1941.

Mossop, William Joseph (1875–1942), first appointed 1900; Attendant, 1910; Library Attendant, 1928; Senior Library Attendant, 1933; retired 1940. Scott, Leigh (1888–1963), MA; first appointed 1906; Assistant, 1913; Acting Accountant, 1919–20; Librarian, University of Melbourne, 1926–53; see introduction, pp. 34–7 in this issue, to 'Mainly from memory'.

Shannon, James Alipius (1869–1940), first appointed 1886; National Gallery of Victoria Attendant, 1889; Library Attendant, 1900;

Stewart, Alexander, Retired as Clerk/ Accountant in 1884.

Street, Bernard (1881–1959), first appointed 1913; Attendant, 1915; Library Attendant, 1934; Senior Library Attendant, 1935.

Weir, William Paul (1897–1943), BCom; first appointed 1913; Clerk, Department of Labour, 1913; military service, 1916–19; Clerk, PLV, 1926–35; left PLV before 1937.

Whitelaw, Ethel Burdett (1910–1996), BA; first appointed 1926; Assistant, 1926. Married FJ Perry, 1937.

Williams, Neville H, temporary Junior Assistant, c. 1915–19.
