HOW BEQUESTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

When Dr Christopher Baker passed away in 2020, it was his wish to establish a fellowship in memory of his late partner, Kerri Hall.

Kerri was a librarian at the Library from 2001 to 2017. Highly respected for her extensive knowledge of the Library's theatre and performing arts collection, she raised its profile and greatly enhanced access through extensive cataloguing and digitisation projects. Kerri was born and raised in the Victorian Mallee district and remained deeply connected to this region.

As a result of Dr Baker's generosity, his estate has endowed the Kerri Hall Fellowship for Performing Arts, open to creatives, artists and writers from Victoria's Loddon Mallee region.
